

Production Gas-Oil Ratio = YG = GOR

Ratio of [gas production rate](#) $q_G^\uparrow$ to [oil production rate](#) $q_O^\uparrow$:

$$(1) \quad Y_G = \text{GOR} = \frac{q_G^\uparrow}{q_O^\uparrow}$$

The simplest way to model the [GOR](#) in a given well is the [GOR Fractional Flow @model](#):

$$(2) \quad Y_G = \text{GOR} = R_s + \frac{M_{rg}}{M_{ro}} \cdot \frac{B_o}{B_g}$$

which provides a good estimate when the [drawdown](#) is much higher than delta pressure from gravity and capillary effects.
